

1960 Taraschi Front Engine Formula Junior Serial Number #051

The front engine Taraschi Formula Junior serial #051 was built by the Meccanica Taraschi in Teramo, Italy and shipped in March of 1960 to the Biener Pontiac Dealership, which, in 1960, was an exclusive dealer for Taraschi and other Italian manufacturers of sport / race cars in New York, New York.

Formula Junior is an open wheel racing class, started in October 1958 in Italy. This class was designed to offer an inexpensive entry to young drivers to race Formula One type cars with open wheels, a single seat and manual transmission, by using existing mechanical components from production automobiles. The class was immediately successful in Italy with production of these race cars in other countries such as France, England, Germany, and others.

The buyer of the car when it arrived from Italy in 1960 was Mr. Bates. He, after a few races, sold the car in 1961 to Mr. Tom Johnson of Dallas. The car was raced in 1961 and 1962 by Mr. Johnson in Texas and Louisiana, and then it was parked in Johnson's son Alan's garage in Dallas at the end of '62. Alan and his brother Mike took the car apart for restoration, but the project never took off.

Due to the continuous improvements brought to the Junior car class, the price kept rising, making the class too expensive, and causing the end of the class altogether around 1966-68.

At the end of the 60' most of the Junior race cars around the world had been parked and forgotten. However due to the widespread availability of mechanical components from the production automobiles of the 50's and early 60's, utilized for the Junior class from the 90's, most of the Junior cars have been resurrected. The cars are now a very expensive old-new historic vintage car class.


The Taraschi serial # 051 remained disassembled and parked for over 40 plus years in the garage of Alan Johnson until Ugo Piccagli bought the car. He began the restoration process to bring the car to the same condition as the day it left the Meccanica Taraschi factory in Teramo, Italy in 1960.

The Taraschi Junior serial #051 has a Fiat 4-cylinder 1100 cc displacement engine ,4speed manual transmission, drum brakes all around and mounts Borrani spoke wheels, 12" in front and 14" in the rear. Having obtained all needed information for the restoration from the Taraschi records in Teramo, Italy, including original paint combination of the body, Mr. Piccagli dedicated much time and effort to bring the car back to its pristine condition, including the little details. He found even the smallest parts as in the original car including screws, bolts, hoses, clips, carburetors (sand cast 32' Webber) and more.

The following pictures and detailed information on the originality of the car testify on the condition of the car as found and as it is now.
